

BE PREPARED: PSALM 105

Prepare for it: Pray for God's help for this passage to change your heart.

Psalm 105 is an hymn of celebration which rejoices in the history of redemption from Israel's time in Egypt, through the wilderness to the entry into the Promised Land. The psalm highlights God's fidelity as Creator-Ruler and the Redeemer of his people. Ps 105 would have been used religious celebrations; 1 Chron 16:18-36 shows it was used when David brought the Arc of the Covenant to Jerusalem

Read It: Psalm 105:1-6, 23-26, 45b (www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Psalm+105)

What is the theme of the first 4 verse of this psalm??

What reason is given for this praise in vv5,6?

What event is recalled in v23?

How are Israel's years in Egypt summarised in vv 24-26?

How should people respond to God's power and love? (v45b)

Think About It:

What great work of salvation has God worked in your life?

How will you praise the Lord? (Rom 12:1)

Get the Message:

The first 4 verses on Psalm 105 offer a vigorous call to praise by using a succession of verbs ("give praise", "proclaim", "make known", "sing", "tell", "glory", "rejoice") all of which implore the hearer to praise God and to make that praise known to others. The basis for this praise is revealed in vv5,6. The call to "Remember the wonders he has done" gives a powerful reason for this praise. While this psalm specifically calls on "the descendants of Abraham" to remember these deeds it also calls on "all God's servants" to join this remembrance. Verses 7-11 remember God's covenant with Abraham, verses 12-15 celebrate God's protection and verses 16-22 remember God's providence. Our reading picks up again in v23, where the psalmist remembers how, at Joseph's invitation and with God's guidance (Gen 46:1-4) Jacob (also known as Israel) took his family down to Egypt (also known as the land of Ham) to escape the famine gripping Canaan. There, as God had promised, Jacob's descendants flourished and the people of Israel became so numerous the Egyptians came to fear them and so made them slaves. The rest of the psalm recalls how God, through Moses, led the Israelites from Egypt, through the wilderness and into Canaan. As people recognise and celebrate how God has used His power and love to rescue them, the people can do only one thing: praise the Lord! Paul uses exactly this thought in Col 1:12,13 when he tells us to be always "giving joyful thanks to the Father...For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves"
