BE PREPARED: PSALM 78

Prepare for it: Pray for God's help for this passage to change your heart.

Psalm 78 is a psalm of confession that teaches how The northern kingdom of Israel (Ephraim) lost its blessing in favour of Judah which had the Temple and produced King David and God's Messiah (Jesus) came from the line of David. The psalm is "A maskil of Asaph". The meaning is not certain but it may mean it was written by Asaph or used by the Asaphites (temple singers) and it is intended to teach something

Read It: Psalm 78:1-4, 11-16(www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Psalm+78)

What does the psalmist do to attract the reader's attention? (vv1-3)

What are the "hidden things" the psalmist will reveal? (v4)

Did the people always remember God's acts of power? (vv11,12)

What events are recalled in vv13,14? Why are they significant?

Why are the events recalled in vv15,16 so significant?

Think About It:

Do you think God still give His people light and life?

How does this message apply to us today? (1 Cor 10:2-4)

Get the Message:

Psalm 78 opens with a call to wisdom. The psalmist catches the reader's attention by promising to speak of "hidden things". These "hidden things" are only hidden in the sense that they cannot be discovered unless God reveals them. It was by His actions that God had revealed the "things our ancestors have told us". These things that have been revealed to the ancestors and will be not hidden from the descendants relate to "the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done". The psalmist then goes on to recall the major history of the Exodus from Egypt, the time in the wilderness and the entry into the Promised Land. In retelling these events, the psalmist also reminds the reader of Israel's disobedience. In the verses leading up to v11 the psalmist recalls how, particularly when they entered the Promised Land, the "men of Ephraim" (a reference to the northern kingdom) failed in battle because they failed to trust in God. They forgot what God had done in the past; how God had led the Israelites from Egypt, dividing the Red Sea to give them an escape route the Egyptians could not follow. Once in the desert God was their true leader, guiding them with a pillar of cloud in the day and a pillar of fire at night. But God was more than a source of guidance, He was also a source of life, providing life-giving water in the wilderness (Nu 20:11). When Paul wrote to the Corinthians he used these events as a model of how, through Jesus Christ, God continues to rescue, lead and give life to those who trust Him, saying the ancients: "drank from the spiritual rock that accompanied them, and that rock was Christ" (1Cor 10:4)
