## BE PREPARED: PSALM 20

**Prepare for it:** Pray for God's help for this passage to change your heart.

Ps 20 is a royal psalm. It is a psalm of David and is concerned with God's blessing on the king when the nation is facing a time of distress. It is not clear what specific event might have led David to write this psalm, but it is likely from David's early years when he was tasked with subduing the surrounding nations. The psalm was sung by the people so we can read it as a prayer of the people for their king.

**Read It:** Psalm 120([www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Psalm+20](http://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Psalm+20))

Who is making this prayer? For what do they pray?(v1)

For what specific things to the people pray? (vv2-4)?

Are the people confident that God will answer their prayer? (v5)

Who is speaking in v6-8? What do these words tell us about David's faith?

How does the psalm end? (v8)

### Think About It:

Why can David expect God to assist him?

Do you believe that God can and will help when you ask?

### Get the Message:

This is a prayer of the people made for their king in times of trouble. Israel understood the king as God's agent of blessing, so they pray that God will hear and answer the king when he calls on the Lord. The use of the "name of the God of Jacob" reminds us of the covenant God made with Abraham, to protect and prosper Abraham's seed. Verses 2-4 make three specific requests of God: that God sends the king help and support from the sanctuary (v2 – the sanctuary in the Temple on Mt Zion was where God dwelt with His people); that God remember the king's faithfulness in making sacrifices and offerings as the Law demanded (v3) and that God give the king "desire of your heart" – which was presumably that God's name be glorified with the victory. V5 follows these prayers with a statement of certainty that God will act as the assure the king "We will shout for joy when you are victorious". Vv6-8 appear to form the king's response to the people's prayer. The psalmist, who is also the king, responds with a statement of personal faith: Yahweh (David uses God's covenant name) is faithful; Yahweh hears and answers His anointed; Yahweh give victory to the king ("His anointed"). Some peoples may trust in military might but they are bought to their knees; the king, on behalf of all Israel, declares that his trust is in "the name of the Lord" and so Israel will rise up. It is the faith of king and people that make this prayer effective, The psalm ends as it begins, with the people praying for God to support His king.
