

BE PREPARED: PSALM 51

Prepare for it: Pray for God's help for this passage to change your heart. The ascription to Psalm 51 tells us this is a psalm of David, written in response to being confronted with his adultery with Bathsheba by Nathan. It is a psalm of individual lament which reveals David's contrition and his desire for restoration. The psalm highlights the need for God's grace in restoring the sinner to communion and joy.

Read It: Psalm 51:1-12(www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Psalm+107)
How does David come to God after facing his sin? (vv1,2)
What important realisation has Nathan provoked in David? (vv3,4)
How deep seated is sin in the human heart? (v5) Why, and how, can God teach us wisdom, even in the womb? (v6)
What is the first thing David asks for in vv7-9?
What second thing does David asks for in vv10-12?

Think About It:

Without a "Nathan" to confront us, how can we know our sin?
What awaits the penitent who turns to God for forgiveness?

Get the Message:

David surely was aware his that dealings with Bathsheba and her husband were wrong, but it took Nathan's parable of injustice (2 Sam 12) to make him realise the true significance of what he had done. Faced with the enormity of his sin, David realises he can do nothing to earn forgiveness so his prayer is simply for God's mercy. Like David, we cannot earn forgiveness and must depend entirely on God's grace. The beginning of true repentance is a proper understanding of how far we are from righteousness. While it is in our human nature to try to justify our behaviour as right, in vv3,4 David admits that deep in his heart he knows of his sin and that God is justified in judging him to be unrighteous. David's confession is much more than just confessing an individual unrighteous act; he recognises that it is part of human nature to seek to please our own selfish desires rather than to live a life that loves God and follows His ways of justice and compassion. He expresses this by saying "surely I was sinful from birth". If we are fundamentally sinful, how can we know what is right? David's answer in v6 is that even before we are born God is working to reveal Himself to each of us, indirectly through creation and directly through the scriptures. With this understanding of sinfulness and grace, David asks God for two things: firstly, he asks to be made clean from past sins (vv7-9) – this is necessary for joy to be restored; and secondly he asks for a pure heart and willing spirit so he will not sin again. The heart that God restores will always know the joy of being in God's presence.
