

BE PREPARED: PSALM 139

Prepare for it: Pray for God's help for this passage to change your heart.

Ps 139 is classified as a thanksgiving psalm, with some commentators favouring individual thanksgiving and some communal thanksgiving. It forms part of the last group of Davidic psalms in the Psalter (Pss 138-145). It is not clear what specific circumstances inspired this psalm.

Read It: Psalm 138

How does v1 set the tone for this psalm? Who is David praising? Before whom does David sing God's praise? (v1)

Why does David sing the praises of Yahweh? (vv2,3)?

Does David see that praising God is just for the Israelites? (vv4,5)?

What particular aspect of God's character does David celebrate in v6? What lesson does this have for God's people?

How will this knowledge of God affect the way David lives? (v7) On what truth about God does David rely? (v8)

Think About It:

How has God been faithful in your life?

How does the fact of God's faithfulness affect the way you live?

Get the Message:

The tone of praise is set from the outset in this psalm, as David announces his intention to give praise to God. Although the Hebrew text of v1 does not name God explicitly, later in the psalm, (v4) David uses the name God gave the Israelites at Sinai: Yahweh. This name reminds the listener of God's covenant with Israel. David announces his intention to praise Yahweh "before the gods", that is, he will announce his love of Yahweh before any of the false idols who might claim his allegiance. The reason for this praise is Yahweh's love and faithfulness towards His covenant people, and particularly towards David himself: when David called on God for help, God answered him. Because of this, Yahweh's name is exalted above all things. Although Yahweh had made a covenant with Israel, David understood Yahweh was the God of all, so he calls on "all the kings of the earth" to praise Yahweh and join him in singing God's praises. One reason David calls on the great people of earth to praise Yahweh is given in v6: though Yahweh is exalted in Heaven ("on high"), yet He knows each person; He can and does know their hearts and looks on the lowly with favour but easily identifies the proud for who they are. The consequence of God's power and love is that David can face the troubles of life with confidence: God will both save David and achieve His purpose for David. David knew his faith in God was not in vain, and we, too, can have confidence in God's faithful providence.
